

Sustainable bride



She has recently launched a 10-piece sustainable bridal collection that celebrates Irish lacemaking, collaborating with the few remaining women in this country who still make lace by hand. Using highly intricate Carrickmacross and Clones style lace, the designs are taken from her own sketches of flowers and nature. The collection, called Arabella, features gowns with square necklines, thigh high splits and asymmetric draping, made in eco-friendly fabrics (so no polyester), slimline bias-cut satin, structured crepe and sheer georgette with back details a key focus. 




Tress to impress
